

I was born on August 11, 2001 in Ankara. I was mostly interested in sports and new media when I was young, I became interested in art, philosophy and politics in high school.

I started actively practicing art at the Ankara Art Theater, where I was trained as a trainee and performed in the plays "Televizyon Cumhuriyeti" and "Azizname" on the stage of the Ankara Art Theater, and represented my high school Ayrancı Anadolu in a short film festival. I took part in the dance show of the Anatolian Fire, as an actor in the play "Prometheus". While working as an actor, photographer and drummer at the same time, I discovered that my real interest was in storytelling. I first tried storytelling in the poems and songs I wrote.


In university, I directed a photonovela called "Cure for the Itch" and an experimental short film called "Çanta". I made made two different installations on conscious dreams and people's fears. I have written short film scripts "GÖK", "Çok Geç", "O" and a feature film script "Yolculuk, İntikam ve Sevda".

On the one hand, I became interested in cinema theories and design styles, and wrote a research paper on Trainspotting 2 and the Three Colors trilogy.

I wrote and directed two low-budget student films, "Everlasting" and "Afternoon Reverie". I have won "Best Student Filmmaker" special award for "Afternoon Reverie" in "Eastern European Film Festival" and also the movie has multiple nominations including finalist in "Adana Golden Boll Festival" which is one of the most prestigious film festivals in Türkiye.




My understanding of cinema


I am interested in postmodern cinema and making postmodernist films. Characteristics of postmodernist cinema I am mostly interested are: non-linear narrative, subjectivism, magic realism, pop culture, consumerism, late capitalism, disorientation and most importantly hyperrealism.

Hyperrealism is the only common theme I used in both of my short movies. I believe a director should tell the stories of his time and hyperrealism is the biggest theme in the social media conquered world because nobody can identify what is real and what is fiction. I like to walk between blurred lines of reality and fiction.






My Understanding of Modern World






This was my first short movie that was longer than 5 minutes and made as profesional as it can be. I was interested in postmodernist cinema and I wanted to made movie where hyperreality was main theme. I wanted to talk about the one of the most common problem of modern world people: nostalgia. I took a metaphysical approach to demonstrate what I wanted to tell. Main character doesn't realize he is stuck in the same places of his childhood and doesn't realize he has a life outside of it. I made a dialogue-heavy, slow-paced, metaphysical movie. This movie didn't get any nominations but it teaches me valuable things that help me to made a better movie a year after.

Deniz produce his film against all odds but he become broke, hoping prizes from festivals for his film will pay his dues but he got rejected by every festival he sent to. He still wants to become a director but he slowly realizes his talent is in engineering, not directing. Coming back and forth with his dreams and memories, he will decide what to do with his future at Söğütözü station.






I change my approach to filmmaking and writing for this movie. I stopped doing dialogue-heavy, slow-paced metaphysical movies and made a short movie fastpaced and focused on visual-storytelling. Contrary to my previous projects, I wrote about something I wanted to tell and relate to the character's struggles, feelings. I wanted to make social realist movie showing our generations struggles. We made a film for people who are going through quarter life crisis in our generation to reflect on our miseries and to evoke feeling of bittersweetness and thoughts about our generations consumerism, unresponsive nature and laziness in the context of person who is in his/ her 20s in 2020s. I tried to show how as we grow up we are getting away from our dreams, future is inevitable and doesn't wait us, our addiction to consumerism reduces our productivity. This film and screenplay was also great mirror for me to understand what I was doing and who I am.











My other audiovisual works

I directed three short films. Two of them, How to Boil an Egg and The Bag are experimental, other one, Unbearable Pain of Nostalgia, was crime, whodunit type of movie. I didn't send these movies to any festival, I take these productions as learnings to understand myself as artist and a leader of a crew. Making experimental movies was fun but not something I wanted to do for the rest of my life. After these productions I become sure I wanted to be fiction movie director, I wanted to tell stories.

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
